Your Legal Advisor in Family Matters.. "They Beat Me to Force Me to Give Up My Inheritance" A Young Woman Cries for Help After Her Father's Death



A young woman named Fatma has issued a plea for protection after being violently assaulted by her uncles, who are attempting to take over her late father's property. According to Fatma, her uncles began threatening her immediately following her father's death. They took control of his apartment and denied her and her siblings' access to it.

Fatma filed a police report and obtained a court ruling that granted her legal access to the apartment, which was enforced with police presence. However, her ordeal did not end there.

She recounted that her uncles, along with their sons, chased her using a car and several tuk-tuks while wielding bladed weapons. They abducted her, brutally assaulted her, and caused serious injuries. She added that a total of 13 individuals were involved, including her grandmother, uncles, aunts, and their sons.

During the attack, they stole her gold jewelry, mobile phone, and handbag. Shockingly, they filmed the entire incident and shared the footage on social media.

Fatma revealed that she was taken to an apartment where she was severely beaten and coerced into signing blank documents aimed at forcing her to forfeit her legal rights. She is now appealing to the relevant authorities for urgent protection.

Your Legal Advisor in Family Matters answers as follows:

Article 49 of the Inheritance Law stipulates: "Without prejudice to any harsher penalty provided for in any other law, anyone who deliberately withholds the rightful share of an heir from the inheritance, or conceals a document that proves the entitlement of an heir, or refuses to hand over such a document upon request by any of the legal heirs, shall be punished with imprisonment for no less than six months and a fine ranging from EGP 20,000 to EGP 100,000, or by either of these two penalties."

In case of repeat offense, the penalty shall be imprisonment for no less than one year.

In Fatma's case, in addition to her right to report the unlawful withholding of her inheritance, she is also entitled to file a criminal complaint for the attempted abduction and coercion she experienced. This is supported by Article 290 of the Penal Code, which states: "Anyone who kidnaps a person through deceit or coercion shall be punished with a minimum of ten years of imprisonment."
