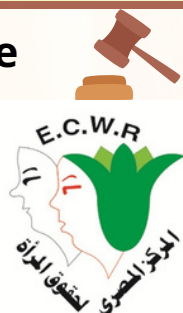

- Politically:** Creating opportunities for young people to participate in decision-making and civic engagement.
- Economically:** Providing fair employment opportunities and supporting entrepreneurship.
- Knowledge and Skills:** Advancing education and developing digital and leadership skills.
- Socially:** Promoting equality, legal protection, and equal opportunities.

Youth Empowerment Under the Egyptian Constitution

The Egyptian Constitution of 2014 explicitly guarantees youth empowerment in Article 82, which obliges the state to:

Ensure the care and development of youth and adolescents: Work to identify their talents and develop their cultural, scientific, psychological, and physical capacities, while providing them with the necessary resources and opportunities.

Encourage collective and volunteer work: Empower young people to participate in public and political, social, and economic life.

Legal Concepts



The United Nations Youth 2030 Strategy focuses on five key areas:

1. Leadership and Participation: Engaging young people in decision-making and public policy.
2. Education and Skills: Providing digital and vocational training to prepare young people for the labor market.
3. Economic Empowerment: Supporting entrepreneurship and creating decent employment opportunities.
4. Peace and Security: Engaging young people in peacebuilding and conflict prevention and resolution.
5. Rights and Equality: Protecting young people from discrimination and supporting the empowerment of girls.

Youth empowerment also contributes to the achievement of several Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), including:

- Goal 1: No Poverty
- Goal 5: Gender Equality
- Goal 10: Reduced Inequalities

Legal Updates

Article 180 of the Egyptian Constitution establishes a quota of at least 25% of the seats on local councils for young people aged 21 to 35, ensuring their legal and representative participation in the management of public affairs.

The Article (180) provides: "Every local unit elects a local council by direct, secret ballot for a term of four years. A candidate must be no younger than 21 years old. The law regulates other conditions for candidacy and procedures of election, provided that one quarter of the seats are allocated to youth under 35 years old, one quarter is allocated for women, workers and farmers are represented by no less than 50 percent of the total number of seats, and these percentages include a proper representation of Christians and people with disability."

Your Legal Advisor in Family Matters... "The Fastest Trial in History" — Court Sentences Defendants for Assaulting Their Mother



The defendants' mother attended the trial session and insisted on exercising her legal rights, refusing to reconcile or withdraw the charges brought against her two sons.

During the hearing, one of the defendants addressed his mother from inside the defendants' cage, expressing his anger at her legal position. He said to her: "Thank you very much, Mom. You did what you wanted and got us imprisoned." Another defendant attempted to express his shock that their disputes had escalated to the point of reaching the courts.

The incident dates back to a video circulated on social media showing a woman calling for help after being assaulted by her sons. The victim explained that the dispute arose because her sons were unemployed and were pressuring her to sell the apartment in which she currently resides.

From a Legal Perspective, Your Lawyer Explains:

Although there are no explicit legal provisions specifically criminalizing domestic violence, in cases involving assault, there are key provisions in the Egyptian Penal Code that serve as the legal basis for most misdemeanor cases involving physical assault.

Article 242 of the Penal Code: Article 242 concerns simple assault, meaning an assault that does not result in serious injuries or that results in incapacity to perform personal work for a period of less than twenty days.

Penalty: Imprisonment for up to one year, or a fine.

Article 375 bis of the Egyptian Penal Code

"Any person who, personally or through another person, displays force, threatens or intimidates with violence, or uses violence against the victim, the victim's spouse, or any of the victim's ascendants or descendants, with the intent of terrorizing or intimidating them by causing them any material or moral harm, damaging their property, taking their money, obtaining a benefit from them, influencing their will in order to impose control over them, or compelling them to perform or refrain from performing an act, shall be punished by imprisonment for a period of not less than one year.

The penalty shall be doubled, in both its minimum and maximum limits, if the act is committed by two or more persons, or if it is committed against a female."

The competent misdemeanor court sentenced two brothers to one year and six months in prison, and fined each of them EGP 20,000, after they were accused of assaulting their mother by beating and verbally abusing her, as well as displaying force and engaging in thuggery inside the family home in the Sayeda Zeinab area.
